### **DEVOTION**

Sunday, March 25, 2021

As a child growing up in the Shepherd congregation, I learned to serve the church by participating as an acolyte and singing in the children's choir. At Mom's side I helped with church functions and became very good at washing dishes. It was when I went through catechism classes and was confirmed, that our Pastor of that time began to introduce me to the ideology of what I had seen in Mom all along, how to serve others in and through our church.

As we were then, we are once again, a church who sees beyond our walls and ourselves, and believes in and practices service to others. We see our mission as more than just our congregation and our facility. While we try to put into practice our mission through serving others and our communities, we never really know if we are successful in our attempts. We may see more people attending our special events and the health of our congregation grow through the increase in numbers attending services both online and in person. We may see the stability of our finances from your generous contributions. We *may* see these things as signs of our success as a congregation. But are we really succeeding in our mission to serve Christ? Are we successful at sharing our faith and serving others?

Two things happened the weekend I sit to write this. Two things that helped me to see we are successful in working toward our mission of faith and service.

The first happened before our first funeral here at Shepherd in over a year. As Treasurer/Secretary I gather the church mail and distribute it. We received an envelope addressed to Shepherd which included a donation and note from someone who is not local. There is nothing unusual about that. What was unusual was the contents of the note. The note said "Enclosed please find a donation to the church to honor Bill Wendorf's service to the community". As Bill was in the church at the time, I went to him with this note. After he read it, he explained how he knew this couple outside of our church. Then he said something very typically Bill. He said that while the words humbled him, he really took them as a reflection of our congregation. He frequently says that he is only the shepherd of the flock, and he repeated it again. It is due to our faith, love, and service, guided by our shepherd, that others see and recognize that we are here to provide service as commanded.

The second thing to happen this weekend was a comment from a family member after the funeral held here that day. She offered her thanks for our help with the funeral and the gathering following the service. She then followed up with a comment that I have heard from others, but which really struck me this time. Someone here for such a solemn occasion as a funeral, had the time to tell me that she always feels so welcomed when visiting Shepherd. To me, this is yet another indication that we are serving Christ through service to others.

We heard many readings during the Easter season that speak to me. One of those that makes the biggest impact on me is as follows:

John 13:12-14

<sup>12</sup> When he had washed their feet and put on his outer garments and resumed his place, he said to them, "Do you understand what I have done to you? <sup>13</sup> You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. <sup>14</sup> If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet.

This particular day reminded me that we are making differences, large and small. We are living in service learned through the example set by Christ.

Thank you, Lord for all of the many Blessings you bring into our lives every day. Please help us to better serve you, our congregation, and our neighbors. Amen.

Adjourned meeting with Lord's Prayer.


### QUILTING

### **RECIPE CORNER**

This month will be an easy recipe. My rhubarb is coming up, so maybe there will be some available in May. Best when served with whipped topping or ice cream

### Easy Rhubarb Cake

- 4 cups rhubarb sliced fresh or frozen
- 1 3oz package raspberry Jell-O (can be sugar-free)
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 1 package yellow or white cake mix
- 1 cup water
- 1/3 cup butter melted

Preheat oven to 350 degrees
Grease a 9X13 pan
Sprinkle the rhubarb in bottom of baking pan
Sprinkle evenly with gelatin then the sugar, then the dry cake mix.
Pour the water over the dry ingredients and, then drizzle with the melted butter.

Bake about 50 minutes or until rhubarb is tender
Serve warm or cooled.

He felt loved and accepted and was able to experience the true joy that he had witnessed in the other campers.

Today. Josh acknowledges that the invitation from his fellow high school campers changed his life. Cod worked through that moment to allow him to begin to let his walls down. Thanks to that interaction and many that followed, Josh is striving to mature into the person God wants him to be. This summer, Josh will be serving on our staff for the second time as a Cabin Leader. He is committed to inviting all of his campers to be open to the experiences of Fortune Lake so that they too may grow in faith.

We invite you to help us provide life changing experiences for campers like Josh.


