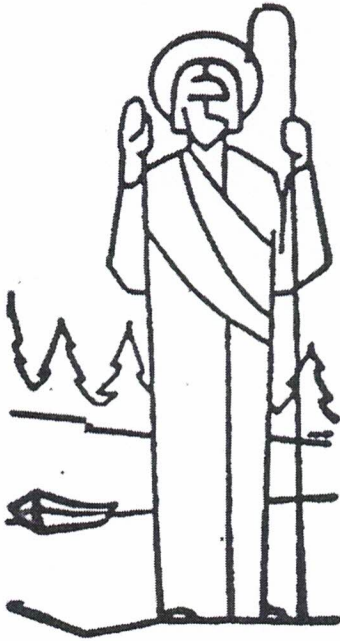

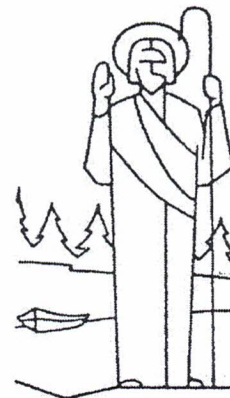

Matthew 14: 28-33

Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." ²⁹He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. ³⁰But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" ³¹Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" ³²When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

Brothers and Sisters in Christ;

In the story above, Peter sees Jesus walking on the water in the midst of a storm. Instead of asking for the storm to cease, Peter sees safety and security in Jesus, and asks to come to him, and Jesus replies "Come". But after getting out of the boat and walking towards Jesus, Peter is distracted by the wind and the waves and begins to sink, only to be saved by Jesus.

As the summer progresses, I look back at the last 6 months and reflect on where we were on March 8th, and where we have come today as church and as a community. Many things have changed, and what the future has to bring is a bit uncertain as well. It seems as though far too many days are like being in the midst of some type of storm, from being bombarded by an overwhelming amount of negative news, or struggles in our personal lives, or health issues of our own or a loved one, or the loss of someone very special to us. And at times, like Peter, we cannot help but be distracted by these things, and lose our focus on the one in whom there is safety, security, hope, and from whom all blessings flow.

It is in our Lord Jesus that we look to sustain ourselves living in these extraordinary times, looking to him as our ever-present strength and shield. Being always thankful for the many blessings we enjoy such as the health of our church family, and a ministry that continues, in the name of Christ, to positively impact the lives of many.

Know that the wind and waves of life will continue to try and distract us. And although we pray for a world at peace and the return to some type of normalcy, we know that true peace lies in the love of our Lord and Savior, and our focus on him. And rest assured that if we should be distracted, and lose focus, like Peter, Jesus will always be there to comfort, reassure, and save us as well.

- Bill begins new school course August 24, 2020.
- Treasurer's report: bank balances look good. Suggestion was made to include Budget vs. Actual Income and Expense be published regularly.
- Secretarial Position: Samantha Thompson will be helping to organize and computerize secretarial records.
- Barb Cashman to be presented a gift card and retirement greeting card by Sharon Geist.
- Thanksgiving dinner discussed and will be held with the help of St. Marys congregation.
- Pet Blessing set for September 19 at 3:00 p.m. Sharon and Karen Seehafer-Petersohn are point persons.
- Council approved south entrance enclosure addition proposal from Mike Everson and to call Congregational meeting to approve expenditure on August 16th.
- Air Conditioning system on north end of building out of service. Replacement to be ordered and paid for from Building Fund.
- Bids for new copier for office to be obtained from Clermont.
- New church sign being researched.
- Landscaping bids being sought.
- Endowment Fund financial statements presented.

DEVOTIONS

Taking on the Sting of Death

"The sting of death is sin, and the power of the sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." *I Corinthians 15:56, 57*

I have come face to face with a rattlesnake, and it's terrifying. So, when I heard about Sandy Newman and her six-month-old golden retriever, Sammy, stumbling upon a rattler in the walking path, my stomach dropped. Not paying attention, Sandy nearly stepped on it.

But Sammy **was** paying attention. He sprang into action, jumping in front of Sandy as the snake struck out. Though he saved his owner, Sammy received a vicious bite on the face. The swelling began immediately.

Knowing the puppy didn't have much time to survive, Sandy rushed him to a nearby animal hospital where they administered anti-venom medication and monitored him for the next twelve hours. When she went to get him, she breathed a huge sigh of relief to see that Sammy had made a full recovery. "This is what a true hero looks like," she said.

What a beautiful picture of bravery, loyalty, and sacrifice. Even at such an early age, that puppy knew the snake was an enemy and chose to take on himself the danger in order to save his master.

How much more powerful and moving when I think about the brave, loyal, and sacrificial Savior Who has done the very same for you and me. He took on the sting of death—the venom of our sin—and saved us from its deadly effects. When we were in danger of death, He too sprang into action to protect us and save us. How amazing was Sammy; how much **more** amazing is our hero, Jesus!

Jesus, thank You for stepping in to save me by taking upon Yourself what the evil one meant for me. Because of what You have done, I no longer have to fear the power of sin in my life. Amen.

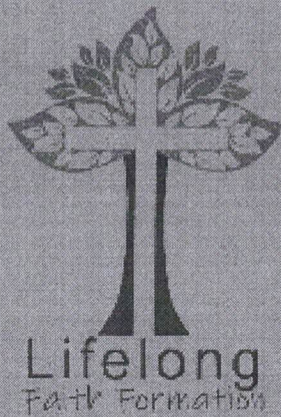

The Northern Great Lakes Synod is launching a new series of classes for those who want to grow in spirituality, faith, and knowledge.

In these challenging and uncertain times, our Synod is offering online classes this fall and winter. While discussions through computer screens are not ideal, online learning presents an opportunity to connect people from across the synod – people who share a love of learning and have discovered that adult studies help them to grow in faith. “**Lifelong Faith Formation**” evolved from our Synod’s Lay School for Mission.

Classes are FREE. “Greek” requires the purchase of the textbook *A Primer of Biblical Greek* by N. Clayton Croy. Materials are available for optional purchase for “Bias in our Communities.” Students will receive ZOOM links from their instructor.

This new effort is not driven by an end result such as graduation from a program. It is not a certification program to become a Licensed Lay Minister. “Lifelong Faith Formation” is designed for curious adults who want to become better equipped to serve the work of Christ in their congregations.

RECIPE CORNER

Here is another seasonal recipe I feel compelled to make annually. Not a big fan of pickles, but I like these and got this recipe from another high school friends as a result of our annual get-togethers. A good dish for summer cook-outs or sharing.

Refrigerator pickles

3 pounds cucumbers including peel, sliced thin

1 pound onions, sliced thin

1 red pepper sliced

1 green pepper sliced

2 cups vinegar

3 cups sugar

1/4 cup salt

In large bowl combine sliced vegetables

Mix together vinegar, sugar and salt and pour over vegetables.

Refrigerate at least overnight

Use in 4–6 weeks.

Do not cook or heat.

Warning: I used a mandolin to achieve thin slices and once cut a chunk out of my thumb, so while the thumb healed, there is still a little hollow of flesh missing. I am just not safe around sharp objects.

Jan sent the recipe below before she decided to replace it with the pickle recipe. It sounded so good that it had to be included as well!

A little late in the season, but hopefully we will still have summery weather later in Aug. or for over Labor Day weekend. I just made this for a birthday treat for a friend who loves creamsicles.

Creamsicle Cake

- 1 package yellow cake mix
- 2 packages orange Jell-O (3 oz size)
- 1 package vanilla instant pudding (small size)
- 1 cup 2% milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 8 oz container frozen whipped topping

Bake the cake as box directs in a 9X13 pan. Let cool completely
Poke holes in cooled cake. Dissolve 1 package orange gelatin with 1 cup boiling water. Add 1 cup cold water and pour this over cake. Cover and refrigerate this for 4 hours. Meanwhile mix the pudding with cold milk the other package of orange gelatin and vanilla. Beat by hand with a wire whisk until thickened. Then fold in the thawed whipped topping and frost the cake.

This needs to be a little more “orange-y” so I add some orange zest or some frozen orange juice concentrate. I just use a regular silverware fork for poking holes – a lot of little ones rather than larger holes.

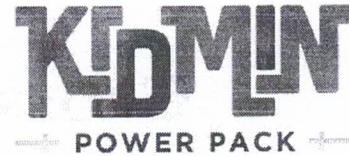
Church School page

Not-So-Straight Obstacle Race

Students will complete a silly obstacle course where, instead of running straight to the finish line, they will have to hop, skip, jump, and do whatever else the course tells them! As they lose the simple freedom of running to the end, they will be reminded to appreciate what they have today.

Materials

- Chalk

Objective

Get through the obstacle course the fastest.

Preparation

This game is best played outdoors. In a large area, make an obstacle course with chalk. Draw a long squiggle line, a hopscotch court, circles, anything you can think of to keep students on course. Make sure the course twists and turns and is not in a straight line.

Introduction

As we celebrate the Fourth of July, we are reminded that freedom is a gift. Today we are going to play a game that will help us remember our freedom with gratitude.

Instructions

1. Explain what each part of the obstacle course means (i.e. students may not take their feet off the squiggle line, they must hop from one circle to the next, they must skip down the dotted line, etc.) and choose one student to go first.
2. If they mess up, they must go back to the beginning and start over.
3. Time the student.
4. Repeat until everyone has had a chance to go.
5. The student with the fastest time wins.
