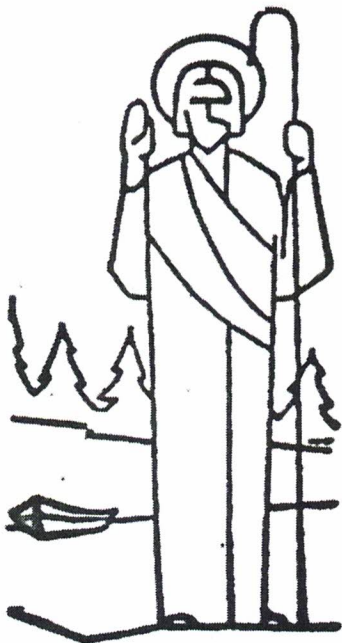

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Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

To say it has been an extraordinary year is, I believe, an understatement. Many things and services that we had assumed would always be there, the way they always have been, simply is no longer true. No longer is a shopping trip simply that, with every move outside our homes being well thought out and planned. Many businesses have drastically changed how they do business, some have temporarily closed, and some may not reopen. This also leaves many more people in our communities with an uncertain future, and a higher level of anxiety for their health and financial well-being. And when we consider the unprecedented loss of life, it only adds to the already heavy burden of the times in which we live.

Through faith and through the gifts of the Holy Spirit, we as God's children and people of faith, find the consolation, comfort, and strength to persevere in an ever-changing world. Being thankful for what we have, and still able to reach out to those that are in need, finding different ways of making a difference, serving Christ in and through the needs of our neighbors.

One other way in which we have made a difference is the Pastor's Discretionary Holiday Fund. Entering its fourth year, this fund receives donations starting now, and up to and through Christmas, to be distributed to those in need by the holidays. The history of this fund is quite simple and yet powerful. Four years ago, I was contacted by an old friend feeling blessed, wanting to give something back, and yet struggling with how to do that. He wanted his gift to make a difference by Christmas, all of it, and entrusted that gift to me, to find a way to do just that. After conferring with a handful of members at church, the PDHF was born.

Now SOTL has a number of different ministries. Some through our synod, others directly from Shepherd, that impact people's lives all over the world. What makes the PDHF different is all the donations from this fund stay local (Vilas and northern Oneida Co.). These funds help to support those organizations that see to the needs of our veterans, the homeless, the hungry, and those in a time of transition, with the bulk of the donations going directly to needy individuals, couples, and families in the form of gift certificates for food, clothing and gifts. This fund, as with all of our ministries, has no administrative cost, so the fund is 100% in, and 100% out, and all the gift cards that go to individuals and needy families, are distributed in time for Christmas.

The support for the PDHF has grown steadily over the last three years, leaving me thankful, humbled, and (if you can believe this) at times, speechless. ☺ As I stated earlier, this has been an extraordinary year, with no one left un-affected. But as always, Christmas will come and go as it always does, and it is this time of year we remember, celebrate, and tell again the story of the greatest gift ever given, the beginning of the greatest story ever told, the birth of our Lord Jesus the Christ.

Being always thankful for the past support of this fund, it is my hope and my prayer that in keeping with the spirit of the season, and being thankful for God's great gift of his Son, the support this fund has received in years past will continue, and we as the people of God will continue to serve Christ in and through the needs of our neighbors.

May the Lord bless and keep us all and may we all be a blessing to those in need.

## **RECIPE CORNER**

Here is a recipe for the holidays that is a break from candy and cookies. I was introduced to this, believe it or not, in high school home economics class. Remember those days? I had not thought of it in years, but came across it several years ago and have made it part of my holiday baking since then. This is a sweet bread – no yeast involved.

### **Christmas Fruit Bread**

2 cups flour  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 large egg yolk  
1 cup milk  
12 red candied cherries chopped  
12 green candied cherries chopped  
2 Tablespoons candied fruit  
1/4 cup chopped nuts.

Do line the bottoms of the baking pans and spray with cooking spray or it will stick to pans.

Cool for 5-10 minutes before removing from pans.

The last few years the candied cherries have become very expensive so I just buy one color, maybe some candied pineapple or use some raisins.

Mix all dry ingredients, then adding the cherries, fruit, and nuts.

Mix together the egg yolk and milk, and add to dry ingredients

Mix thoroughly and put in lined bread pans (or 2 smaller pans)

Let stand for 20 minutes

Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or less for smaller pans. Check for doneness with a toothpick

Some thoughts on a traditional Thanksgiving hymn: Now Thank We All Our God

It is possible even to be thankful during the most difficult of circumstances in life. It's true! We see an especially inspiring example of a brave and thankful heart in the story behind one of the Church's most popular hymns, "Now Thank We All Our God." This particular hymn was written during the Thirty-Years War in Germany, in the early 1600s. Its author was Martin Rinkart, a Lutheran pastor in the town of Eilenburg in Saxony.

Now, Eilenburg was a walled city, so it became a haven for refugees seeking safety from the fighting. But soon, the city became too crowded, and food was in short supply. Then, famine hit, along with a terrible plague; Eilenburg became a giant morgue.

In one year alone, Pastor Rinkart conducted funerals for over 4,500 people, including his own wife. The war dragged on; the suffering continued. Yet through it all, he never lost courage or faith. Even during the darkest days of Eilenburg's agony, he was able to write this hymn:

*Now thank we all our God,  
with hearts and hands and voices,  
Who wondrous things hath done,  
In Whom this world rejoices.....  
...(So) keep us in His grace,  
and guide us when perplexed,  
and free us from all ills,  
in this world and the next.*

Even when he was waist-deep in destruction, Pastor Rinkart was able to lift his sights to a higher plane. He kept his mind on God's love when the world around him was filled with hate. He kept his mind on God's promises of heaven when the earth was a living hell. Can we not do the same? ---we whose lives are relatively trouble-free, compared with the man who wrote this hymn? ... To whom will you and I say "Thank you"?
