Peace-filled Hearts

"Jesus said, 'Peace be with you.'" John 20:21a
"A heart at peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones." Proverbs 14:30

For forty-five years after his career as a professional athlete ended, Jerry Kramer was not inducted into his sport's Hall of Fame. He enjoyed many other honors and awards, but this one eluded him. While he had been nominated for this honor ten times, it had never been bestowed. Despite having his hopes dashed so many times, Kramer was very gracious, saying, "I felt like the National Football League had given me 100 presents in my lifetime, and to be upset about one I didn't get was kind of stupid."

Where others might have grown bitter after being denied so many times in favor of other players, Kramer wasn't. His attitude illustrates the way we can safeguard our hearts against the very corrosive nature of envy, which "rots our bones." When we become preoccupied with what we don't have---and fail to recognize the many things we do---the peace of God will elude us.

After an eleventh nomination, Jerry Kramer was ultimately inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame in February, 2018. Our earthly desires may not be realized as his finally were. Yet we can still have a "heart at peace" when we instead focus our attention on the many ways God has been generous toward us. No matter what we want but do not have, we can always enjoy the life-giving peace He brings to our lives.

Heavenly Father, help me to focus on what You have provided. Give me a heart of peace.

RECIPE CORNER

Here is an old-fashioned recipe gleaned from my mother's cookbook, put together by the Ladies Aid. "Back in the day" when the recipes were mimeographed, cut and put together with hole punchers and yarn. They even cut up old wallpaper books for the covers. And, remember ladies, we did not have first names at that time.

I made this one time when the family visited and it became my grandson's favorite. Later his sister called for the recipe to enter in a baking contest in her homeschool group. She took first place – at least that's how I remember it!

These kinds of recipes were popular since living on the farm, we had plenty milk, butter, and eggs.

Poppy Seed Torte

*1 Crust:

1/2 pound graham crackers rolled fine.

1/2 cup butter melted

1/4 cup sugar

Mix together and line a 9X13 pan.

*2 Filling:

3 cups milk

1 cup sugar

3 Tablespoons cornstarch

1 Tablespoon butter

4 egg yolks

1/4 cup poppy seeds

1 teaspoon vanilla

Mix sugar, cornstarch, milk and egg yolks. Slowly bring to a boil and cook about 1 minute.

Add the butter and vanilla and poppy seeds. Pour mixture over crust in pan.

Meringue topping

4 egg whites

4 Tablespoons sugar

1 teaspoon cream of tartar.

Beat the egg whites until almost stiff.

Gradually add the sugar and cream of tartar continuing to beat until stiff peaks form.

Spread this over pudding mixture. Sprinkle with chopped nuts if desired.

Bake in 350 degree oven until meringue is browned. 10 minutes ??? Watch closely

^{*1} Of course, now I use packaged graham cracker crumbs and follow their recipe

^{*2} Better to start the pudding without the egg yolks and temper them before adding to the mixture.

Where I've Seen God Today

A good question to ask yourself is, "Where have I seen God today?" And if you haven't been intentionally asking yourself that question, perhaps the corollary would be, "Where have I seen God in the past week, or months?" I think that most of us understand this question not as a literal seeing of God but as a spiritual question. The assumption in this question is that God is "seeable" and "knowable" on some level. Sometimes God seems quite hidden and not seeable. But, perhaps, by even asking ourselves that question, we might grow in our faith and better "see" God.

So, "Where have I seen God lately?"

- I've seen God in people making phone calls to check in on neighbors and family members during this pandemic.
- I've seen God challenging us to think about hard issues of social justice around race and economic inequalities.
- I've seen God working through the many unnamed researchers who developed vaccines for COVID-19.
- I've seen God in pastors and lay leaders digging deep into their bag of resiliency and trying out new things in their congregations.
- I've seen God in people who had never heard of Zoom joining Bible and book studies through their church and Lifelong Faith Formation classes offered through our synod.
- I've seen God in the generosity of people supporting their local businesses, donating blood, and delivering meals.
- I've seen God surrounding those who grieve many losses including the death of loved ones in recent months.
- I've seen God challenging us to reevaluate what church truly is as more than a building.
- I've seen God in people gathering outside in a church parking lot in lawn chairs and social distancing to find joy in the presence of others.
- I've seen God in pastors and parishioners who gather for worship in parking lots even in bitter cold weather.
- I've seen people spending more time outdoors and appreciating the beauty of God's creation.


If I truly stop to think about it, I've seen God many times!

Sometimes as a pastor, I would ask people before the start of a committee meeting, "Where have you seen God today or this week?" Some people without hesitation would speak up and name something. Others would be silent. I didn't push people to say something. Perhaps they had never considered that question. Perhaps they didn't want to say the wrong thing. Perhaps they didn't have words for how they "saw" God at work.

I'm convinced that as individuals we benefit from asking ourselves that question about "God sightings." God is. And God can be known through Christ, our neighbor, and this created world.

Thank you, Lord, for being present, even when we do not "see" you!
