Adjourned meeting with Lord's Prayer.


QUILTING

RECIPE CORNER

This recipe is called a salad but I use it as a dessert or a cool summer snack. It makes a whole cake pan full, but since it is frozen it can be enjoy it over a period of time if not served to company.

Frozen Cranberry Banana Salad

1 can (20 oz) pineapple tidbits
5 medium firm bananas halved
lengthwise and sliced
1 can (16 oz) whole berry cranberry sauce
1/2 cup sugar
1 carton (12 oz) frozen whipped
topping thawed
1/2 cup chopped walnuts

Drain pineapple juice into medium bowl, setting pineapple aside.

Add cut up bananas to the juice.

In a large bowl, combine cranberry sauce and sugar.

Remove banana, discarding the juice Add bananas to the cranberry mixture Stir in the pineapple, whipped topping and nuts stirring well.

Pour into 9 X 13 pan. Cover and freeze until firm.

Remove from the freezer 15 minutes before cutting.

SERMON SUPPLY:

In order to finish his Certificate of Pastoral Ministry with the Institute of Lutheran Theology by next year, Bill is taking a class this summer. He usually avoids summer classes if possible, because of their condensed time frame which includes all of the content of a 16-week course and our busy summer schedule. Just the name of the class, "Systematic Theology" is intimidating! His class meets twice a week (6 hours) for 8-weeks followed by two weeks for project and exam completion, and is going to be very labor intensive. Due to his summer schedule, Bill's office hours will be set for 9:00 am to 2:00 pm on Wednesdays and Fridays until he has completed his class.
