DEVOTION

Day of Encouragement I Thessalonians 5:14

First responders show dedication and courage daily by being on the front lines when disasters occur. In the attack on the World Trade Center in New York in 2001 when thousands of people were killed or injured, more than four hundred emergency workers also lost their lives. In honor of first responders, the United States Senate designated September 12 as the National Day of Encouragement.

While it may seem unique that a government would declare such a day, the apostle Paul certainly thought this was needed for the growth of a church. He commended the young church in Thessalonica, a city in Macedonia, to "encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone." Although they were going through persecution, Paul encouraged the believers to "always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else." He knew that as humans, they could be prone to despair, selfishness, and conflict. But he also knew they would not be able to uplift one another without God's help and strength.

Things are no different today. We all need to be uplifted, and we need to do the same for those around us. Yet we can't do it in our own strength. That's why Paul's encouragement that "the one who calls you (Jesus) is faithful, and He will do it" is so reassuring. With His help, we can encourage one another every day.

Jesus, thank You for the encouragement You give me each day. Show me who I need to encourage as well. Amen.

RECIPE CORNER

I have taken this recipe for coffee hour and it was well received. Some different flavors for a change.

Apricot Bars

3/4 cup butter or marg

1 cup sugar

1 egg

2 cups flour

1/4 tsp baking pwdr

1 1/3 cups shredded coconut

1/2 cups chopped walnuts

1/2 tsp vanilla

1 jar (12 oz) apricot preserves

In large bowl, cream butter and sugar.

Add egg, mix well.

Combine flour and baking powder.

Gradually add to butter mixture.

Add coconut, walnuts, and vanilla. Mix thoroughly.

Press 2/3 of dough into 9x13 pan.

Spread with apricot preserves.

Crumble remaining dough over

preserves.

Bake @ 350 for 30-35 minutes or until golden brown. Cool in pan.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Instead of giving you financial information, there are some other things to relate to you.

Well.....I'm tempted to say "here we go again", but that would not be entirely accurate. As cases of the Delta variant of Covid 19 increase across the country and here in Vilas County, there are concerns for the safety of our church family.

We have been Blessed here at Shepherd as far as cases of Covid are concerned. The cleaning, sanitizing, and safety measures we have had in place since early in 2020, have kept us all relatively safe.

So once again we are stepping up our efforts in cleaning and sanitizing the church between uses. We are not going to greatly change how we gather here at Shepherd in response to the slowly increasing number of new cases. Some small changes to how we collect offerings and how we present communion are already being put in place.

We are going to remind you of some of the safety measures we have let lapse in recent months before the Delta variant took hold.

- 1. If you do not feel well, even if you think it is just a cold, please consider worshipping online instead of in person.
- 2. Let's get back to reasonable social distancing. Leave room in the pews, in the communion line, in the dining room and at those tables. We really hate to give up all of those wonderful hugs, but please reconsider before approaching someone for a hug.
- 3. If you are un-vaccinated, consider going back to a mask for your own protection. It is not just the un-vaccinated who are getting sick. Even if you are vaccinated, but are in an "at risk" category, please think about masking.
- 4. Hand sanitizer is situated throughout the sanctuary and in the narthex.
- 5. For those of you who feel more comfortable worshipping at home, please let us know what we can do to keep you more connected. Bill is available for home visits and communion if he is invited.

At this time there are no plans to either close the church or cancel any of our late summer or fall events. Simple safety measures will go a long way toward keeping us all safe. Our plans for the Brett & Frisk Event, Pet Blessing service, and Polka service will continue until and unless our situation changes drastically.

So......we will continue to worship and serve our communities and benevolences to the best of our ability during this latest twist in Covid cases. Our mission of service has not changed. This is just to remind you to keep in mind your health and safety.

Your executive committee and council have had plans in place since early in the Covid shut down phase. Due to some questions from congregation members, we are updating those plans and will share them with you via email, the bulletin, and the next newsletter. As we have for the past 18 months, we are receiving information from the Vilas County Health Department on a regular basis and are watching numbers just like everyone else. Your safety is a serious priority for all of us.


