The next council meeting is scheduled for Sunday, October 17, 2021 at 10:30 am.

Approved Council Meeting Minutes for August 22, 2021

In Attendance: Joan Ebert, Lyn Hurbanis, Jeanne Kroll, Jean Maines, Bill Sima, and Bill Wendorf, LLM.

Absent: Tracey Ahlborn, Jack Carlson, Sharon Geist, and Mike Pockat.

Meeting called to order at 10:52 am by President Bill Sima. Mission Statement read aloud by all. Bill Wendorf, LLM opened with prayer.

Pastor's Report:

- Thanked all for prayers and well wishes during illness for Bill and Tina.
- Contingency plans for absence worked as planned.
- Electronics recycling with NATH was full trailer and expense of \$324.00.

Treasurer's Report:

- Review of July and year-to-date financial statements.
- Northwoods Share to be included in 2022 budgeted benevolences.
- Event revenue for summer events resulted in donations of \$358.70 each to Seminary support and to Tri-County Council on Domestic Abuse, and \$925.07 each to ALWM and Sight for Children.
- Decision reached in August to make change of cleaning contractor. Jeanne Kroll to be added as employee.
- July checks reviewed by Lyn Hurbanis with no issues.

Old Business:

- Bell Refubishment: Plans in place to work on after August 28 and before Sept. 25, 2021
- Parking Barriers: Mike Pockat has ordered and expects delivery soon.
- Gazebo (shelter building): Mike Everson waiting on estimate of supplies before completing bid.

New Business:

- Discussion concerning decision to change cleaning services.
- Discussion concerning CDC recommendations and two emails with congregant concerns discussed.
- Bill to get antibody test.
- Notification of positive Covid test procedures discussed.
- Bill S. to put Covid procedures in policy form. (see next page)
- Computer issues discussed concerning streaming and recording.
- Amplifier to be replaced at estimated cost of \$2,383.25. Purchase authorized.

Adjourned meeting with Lord's Prayer.

COVID Policy

SOTL will strive to establish a safe environment for all parishioners to worship following our mission statement. We will respect the feedback and opinions of <u>all</u> our members, visitors, parishioners, and SOTL council members while we work through the evolving situation. We will use CDC guidelines, local health board recommendations, and community feedback, but most importantly provide the opportunity for <u>each</u> parishioner to choose how they will participate and protect themselves.

COVID Guidelines: "Be aware, but not afraid" to quote a SOTL Council Member

- Vaccinations for our SOTL parishioners and staff are voluntary. It is a personal choice depending upon each own healthcare plan.
- Masking guidelines will be reviewed and approved by the SOTL council based upon CDC guidelines, local health boards, community practices, and members/visitor feedback.
 - o Privacy issues surround this issue. Medical privacy is a serious consideration.
 - As of this revision, CDC guidelines recommend masks for various individuals, and we are allowing each parishioner and staff to decide if masking is appropriate for themselves.
 - o If the time comes to require masks to be worn, <u>all</u> will be asked to wear masks.

Communion

- Masks and hand sanitizing are required to be worn while presenting communion and for those preparing the sacraments before service.
- We will not allow an individual to hand-select their communion wafer since it could expose other wafers during the process.
- Offer the choice of dipping the communion wafer or use of individual disposable glass.
- Changes to our plan taken in August 2021 to prevent COVID transmissions:
 - o Improvement to cleaning services.
 - Deep cleaning of restrooms, community room, kitchen, chapel, and high touch/use surfaces.
 - Plans for cleaning if Saturday services or community use of rooms without 4 days of non-use.
 - o Building HVAC "constant on" while being used, auto during non-use time.
 - o Restroom exhaust fans checked and working normally.
 - o MERV 13 air filters to be installed by end of September to help provide additional filtering.
 - o Recommend social distancing and frequent hand washing/sanitizing.
 - o Remind covering cough and sneezes.
 - o Offertory baskets once again out in Narthex. No plate passing.
 - o Passing of Peace from seats.
 - o Hand sanitizer was placed throughout the church.
- We have made great improvements to allow our parishioners and visitors to participate in our services through 5 different options based upon the individual's personal choice:
 - o In-person services inside the chapel.
 - o In-person services outside (during summer months weather permitting).
 - o 2 SOTL inside locations outside of the chapel via TV live broadcast.
 - o Remotely via YouTube Live.
 - o Remotely via recorded YouTube playback.
- The congregation will be asked to notify the executive council of any confirmed cases where SOTL parishioners or visitors may have been exposed.
 - Executive Council determination will be made with <u>individual's written permission</u> to release information to:
 - Only those potentially exposed or Congregation wide.
 - With or without an individual's name being released.
- SOTL Council will review monthly during council meetings and revise this Policy and Guidelines as needed.


