Fresh Strawberry Spinach Salad

1 pt. strawberries, sliced thickly
1 bunch fresh spinach leaves torn into bitsize pieces
½ red onion, sliced thinly
In large bowl, toss berries, spinach, and
onion.

Pour dressing over and toss. Serves 4-6

½ cup mayonnaise

2 Tablespoons white vinegar

1/3 cup sugar

¼ cup milk

2 Tablespoons poppy seeds

Mix all ingredients together well.
