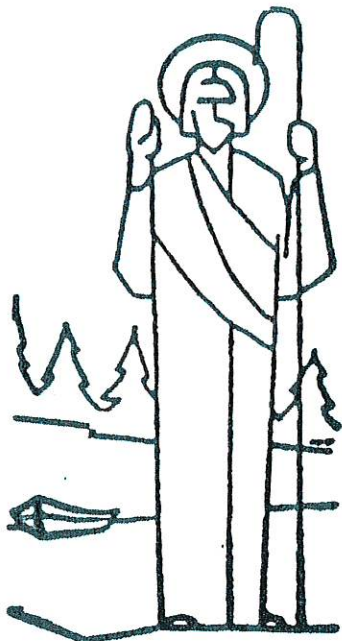

DEVOTION

In God We Trust

"In repentance and rest is your salvation; in quietness and trust is your strength."
Isaiah 30:13

In the early days of the American Revolutionary War, an expedition was launched against British forces in Quebec. When the expedition passed through Newburyport, Massachusetts, on the way to Canada, they visited the tomb of the renowned evangelist George Whitefield. Whitefield's coffin was opened and his clerical collar and cuffs were removed. The clothing was cut into pieces and distributed in the mistaken belief that it could somehow give the soldiers success.

The expedition failed miserably. What the soldiers did demonstrates our human nature to trust in something less than a relationship with God---money, human strength, or even religious traditions--- for our ultimate well-being. God cautioned His people against this when invasion from Assyria threatened, and they sought Pharaoh's help instead of turning from their sins and turning personally to Him:

"This is what the Sovereign Lord, the Holy One of Israel, says: "In repentance and rest is your salvation; in quietness and trust is your strength, but you would have none of that. You said, 'No, we will flee on our horses.' Therefore you will flee!"

Their expedition failed as well (as God said it would) and Assyria overwhelmed Judah. But God also told His people, "The Lord longs to be gracious to you."

Even when we have trusted in lesser things, God still holds out His hand to help us return to Him. "Blessed are all who wait for Him!"

The meeting was officially called to order at 10:37 am by President Bill S.. The mission statement was read aloud by all.

Opening Prayer & Devotion:

Bill W. provided opening prayer.

Approval of Agenda: After review of agenda motion made by Mike to accept agenda, seconded by Jeanne. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Minutes: Minutes from March 27, 2022 reviewed. Motion made to accept minutes by Mike and seconded by Jeanne. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Minutes: Minutes from April 24, 2022 reviewed. Motion made to accept minutes by Jack and seconded by Sharon G. Motion carried unanimously.

Selection of Date & Time for Next Meeting: Sunday, June 19, 2022 at 10:30 a.m.

Pastor's Report:

- Passed newest class, Apologetics, with a B.
- Due to political discussions, Bill will no longer have a vote in Council decisions. He will be attending in an advisory role only.

Treasurer's Report:

- February, March, and April financial council reports reviewed in brief.
- Penny reviewed April bank statements and found only one exception – deposit corrected at bank. Documents provided to support correction to Penny.
- Motion to accept Treasurer's reports made by Sharon R. and seconded by Sharon G. Motion passed with 1 abstention.

Old Business:

Constitution: Review of language concerning property retention reviewed by Atty. John Houlihan. Telephone conference with Mr. Houlihan on May 19th resulted in confirmation that if conditions imposed by the ELCA are followed and if situation is such that Shepherd should leave ELCA to join another Lutheran conference, then property stays with Shepherd. Requested clarification of legal language confirms what constitution committee inferred from review. Further review of proposed constitution will be completed with possible elimination of specific language, followed by additional constitution committee meeting before returning to Council for approval.

Doug pointed out that by accepting constitution revision before scheduled ELCA meeting in 2022 may result in need for further revisions.

Motion made to continue review of proposed constitution made by Karen and seconded by Sharon. Motion carried with one abstention.

Trivia Contest: Cancelled for 2022.

4th of July: Jean to order larger machine and popcorn, oil, salt supplies for current year.

Basketball Hoop: Bill & Graham to work on placement.

Name Tags: Paper name tags to be used until determination of how congregation responds to use.

New Business:

Discussion concerning ELCA politics and temporary suspension of synod funding:

Current national news contains report that ELCA supports abortion laws. Latest in political involvement of ELCA in national politics. Shepherd has worked very diligently to remain a purple (non-political) church. ELCA hierarchy and Bishop Eaton continue to become more politically involved on a national level.

Shepherd does not seem to have a voice to express opinions and/or objections to direction of churchwide decisions. Attempts have been made by council member to contact Bishop Eaton's office and received no response. Synod council members have not been informed of current political expressions. ELCA members on a congregational level seem to have no recourse in actions of churchwide. Discussion followed that if we halt financial support of Churchwide ELCA we may gain their attention, at least to ask why we are not providing support. Motion made to temporarily halt financial support to Synod and through them to the Churchwide body, retain said budgeted funds in separate account to be used for missions, and consultation with congregation to determine if withholding of funds is temporary or permanent made by Karen and seconded by Sharon. Motion carried with one abstention.

Pie & Ice Cream Social: Scheduled for August 6, 2022.

Scholarship Fund: Treasurer reports scholarship fund is in negative balance and wants to consider fundraiser. Possible brunch fundraiser in September suggested.

Motion to adjourn meeting at 12:42 pm made by Sharon and seconded by Sharon. Motion carried unanimously.

Meeting closed with recitation of Lord's Prayer.

RECIPE CORNER

Here is an old recipe that has always been well-received – and it does not need to be frosted.

Chocolate Chip Date Cake

1 cup chopped dates
1 1/2 cups boiling water
1 teaspoon baking soda
Put chopped dates with baking soda in a bowl and pour over the hot water
Set aside to cool.
1/2 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
2 eggs beaten
2 cups flour
3/4 teaspoon soda
1/2 teaspoon salt

Cream shortening, sugar, eggs, and date mixture.

Add flour, soda and salt. Mix well.

Pour into 9X13 pan

6 oz chocolate chips (2 cups)

1/2 cups sugar

1/2 cup chopped nuts

Mix chocolate chips, sugar and nuts together and sprinkle over unbaked batter in pan

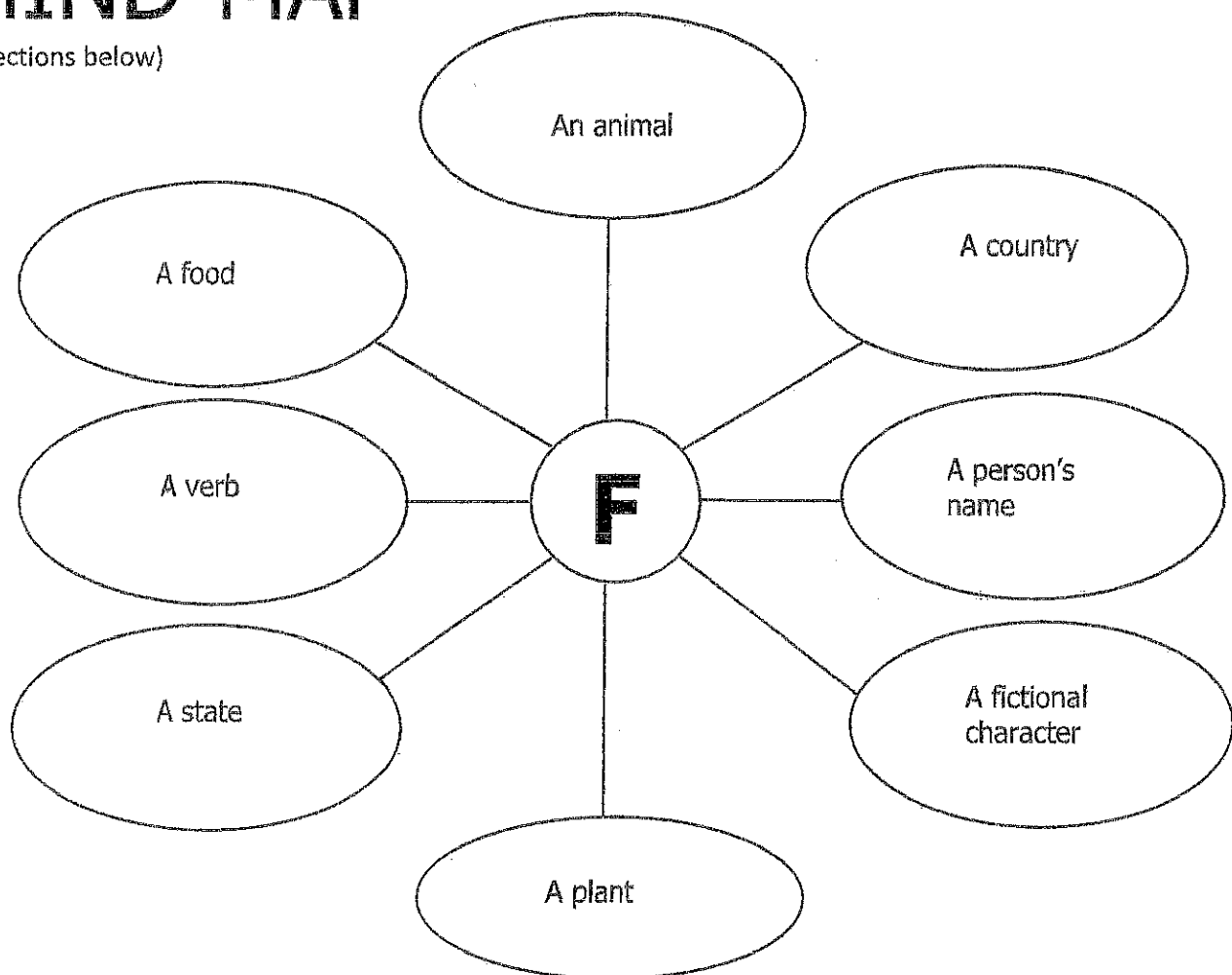
