

DEVOTION

Waiting for a Blessing

Habakkuk 2:3 - "Though it linger, wait for it."

A popular restaurant in Bangkok serves soup from a broth that has been cooking for over forty-five years and is replenished a bit each day. The practice, known as "perpetual stew," dates back to medieval times. Just as some leftovers taste better a few days later, the extended cooking time blends and creates unique flavors. The restaurant has won multiple awards for the most delicious soup in Thailand!

Good things often take time, but our human nature struggles with patience.

The question "How long?" occurs throughout the Bible. One striking example is from the prophet Habakkuk, who begins his book by asking, "How long, Lord, must I call for help, but You do not listen?" Habakkuk (whose name means "grappler") prophesied His judgment on his country (Judah) through the invasion of the ruthless Babylonian Empire, and he wrestled with how God could allow corrupt people to prosper as they exploited others. But God promised hope and restoration in HIs own time. "For the revelation (of God's help) awaits an appointed time . . . though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come, and will not delay."

The Babylonian Captivity lasted seventy years. By human thinking, that's a long time, but God is always faithful and true to His Word.

Some of God's best blessings may be a long time in coming. Though they linger, keep looking to Him! He prepares every blessing with perfect wisdom and care---and He's always worth waiting for!

Father, thank You for Your kindness and faithfulness in every season and blessing of life. Help me to look forward to You most of all. Amen!

REUBEN CASSEROLE

1 (16 oz) jar Sauerkraut, drained and rinsed well

1 ¼ cup chopped, cooked corned beef

1 cup Sour Cream

1 small Onion, chopped

1 clove Garlic, minced

1 cup (4 oz) shredded Swiss Cheese

2 slices Rye bread, cubed

2 T margarine, melted

Combine kraut, beef, sour cream, onion, and garlic. Put into greased 11x7 baking dish. Sprinkle with cheese and bread cubes. Drizzle with butter. Bake, uncovered at 350° for 25-30 minutes.

A NOTICE FROM YOUR TREASURER:

Dear Shepherd of the Lakes Family:

For at least two of the last five fundraising events, the donations from those events have not been handled correctly. As a reminder:

PLEASE USE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE FOR ALL EVENTS THAT INVOLVE THE COLLECTION OF FUNDS:

AT THE END OF THE EVENT (OR PERIODICALLY DURING THE EVENT IF A LARGE AMOUNT OF FUNDS WILL BE RECEIVED) THE CHAIR OF THE EVENT PLUS ONE OF THE FOLLOWING SHOULD PLACE THE FUNDS IN A SECURITY ENVELOPE(S) THAT WILL BE SUPPLIED BY THE CHURCH: TREASURER, HEAD COUNTER, OR ANY OF THE COUNTING TEAM. THE BAG SHOULD PROMPTLY BE SEALED, IDENTIFIED WITH THE NAME OF THE EVENT AND SIGNED AND DATED BY THOSE HANDLING THE FUNDS.

IF YOU EXPECT TO HAVE MORE THAN ONE ENVELOPE DURING THE EVENT, PLEASE BE SURE TO HAVE ONE OF THE FOLOWING THREE PEOPLE WITH ACCESS TO THE CHURCH SAFE AT THE EVENT TO HANDLE THE SECURITY ENVELOPE(S).

PLEASE NOTIFY ONE OF THE ABOVE INDIVIDUALS FAR ENOUGH IN ADVANCE SO THAT YOU CAN BE ASSURED THAT THEY WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THE END OF THE EVENT.

FOR YOUR PROTECTION, NO COUNTING SHOULD TAKE PLACE DURING OR AFTER THE EVENT;
THE COUNTERS WILL COUNT THE FUNDS AND MAKE A SEPARATE DEPOSIT FOR THEM ON THEIR
NORMALLY SCHEDULED COUNTING DAY. THE EVENT CHAIRPERSON WILL BE ADVISED OF THE
TOTAL RECEIVED AT THAT TIME.

These procedures have been in effect for at least 10 years. When the backsplash was installed in the kitchen, we lost our bulletin board over the sink. These procedures had been posted in that location. A new copy is posted there once again as a constant reminder.

It is easy in the excitement of a successful event to want to know how much was given.

DO NOT COUNT THE MONEY AFTER AN EVENT

As with all of our money handling rules, there are reasons behind this one as well.

- 1. To protect yourselves and the beneficiaries of these events from mis-placed funds, or the slightest indication that not all of the donated funds were delivered to the beneficiary.
- 2. To protect the confidentiality of the donors (I can't stress how important this is). The funds donated are to be handled by the counting team only. Every one of the team members has been introduced to the extreme importance of this and do in fact sign a confidentiality agreement. If for some reason it should become known to the public that someone donated a specific amount, how long do you think we would retain our communities' confidence and support? How many leaks (by accident or design) would it take for us to lose our place in the community. I know that if I donated to an organization and they published my donation without my permission, I would never give them another cent.
- 3. To protect the fundraiser staff and the congregation from information in error. In the past event coordinators were very excited to have raised an amount and then were very disappointed later when the organizations were given less than that amount. What needs to be considered in this case is that there are expenses involved in these events. It is not until after all of the expenses are turned in that the true amount of donation is revealed.

Since these procedures have been ignored more and more frequently, we as a church have been exposed to very possible and probable negative results. If this continues, with full Council approval as of February 19, 2023, there will be consequences. Up until now the only consequences have been me losing my temper (which I really hate to do).

The next time this happens, it will mean the end of Shepherd sponsoring fundraising events.

- If event organizers want to use the church facilities, they will need to sign an agreement releasing the church from all consequences that result from the event.
- They will need to have at least one person trained in safe handling of food if their event includes serving to the public.
- They will be required to do all of the facility clean up.
- No funds raised will be handled by Shepherd.
- All expenses will be the responsibility of the event coordinators.

It does not make me happy or excited to be the bad guy in this situation. My whole job as treasurer is to protect Shepherd and all of you from harm in any financial situation. I take my job very seriously and, in this case, with a very heavy heart.


