Go in Peace

With Simeon and Anna we receive consolation (Luke 2:25) and good news: Jesus frees us to go in peace. God's Word is incarnate, and we have seen the light of our salvation (2:29-32). "Go in peace" is our call to action—a reminder that we are freed from sin and death and sent out to share that good news with the world. "Go in peace" is also our prayer as life ends—a reminder of a love more powerful than death.

And yet . . . right along with these words of peace come troubling words from Simeon. The infant Jesus will be a source of turmoil for his people and his family. The words "and a sword will pierce your own soul too" (Luke 2:35) must have been the opposite of peaceful and comforting to young mother Mary. Luke even includes the detail that Mary and Joseph offered the least expensive purification sacrifice, a reminder that Jesus was born into poverty (Lev. 12:8). Even in the presence of God's incarnate peace, all is not well with the world.

This is where we enter the story, full of questions. How do we experience God's peace in our broken world? Faced with the reality of war, poverty, hunger, destruction, and loss, how do we speak of peace? How do we live God's peace in our lives? Like Simeon and Anna, we have faith in God's promise of peace because we have faith in the promiser. As Simeon and Anna witnessed, God's word has been, is, and will be fulfilled.

RESULTS OF THE MEETING FOR SECOND VOTE TO DISAFFILIATE FROM ELCA

We were happy to see so many of you here for this very important meeting.

The vote was overwhelmingly in favor of leaving the ELCA. Of the 81 eligible voting members present, 75 voted "Yes" to the following question:

Should Shepherd of the Lakes Lutheran Church take the steps required to terminate our relationship with the ELCA in accordance with the procedure outlined in Chapter 6 of our Constitution that was approved by the Northern Great Lakes Synod on April 1, 1996.

75 voted Yes, to Terminate and 6 voted No, Do Not Terminate SECOND MEETING TO CHOOSE FUTURE SYNOD AFFILIATION

Immediately after the first meeting, those attending were asked to go through the registration process for a second meeting to determine the direction the church will go now. Following is the Resolution that was presented to those present:

Should Shepherd of the Lakes Lutheran Church approve joint affiliation with Augsburg Lutheran Churches (ALC) & Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC) in accordance with Chapter C7.03 of our Constitution that was approved by the Northern Great Lakes Synod on April 1, 1996.

There were 71 eligible voting members at this meeting. The results of the vote were as follows:

71 voted "Yes" and there were Zero "No" votes

The next step is for the Northern Great Lakes Synod to approve the requested disaffiliation of Shepherd of the Lakes Lutheran Church from the ELCA.
