# SCIENCE EXPERIMENT

# Invisible Egg ink

It's fair to say that Jesus' disciples weren't exactly sure what God was doing when he died on the cross. This experiment with Easter eggs and invisible ink will show the kids that, while it may seem hidden at first, God always has a plan.

#### Materials

- Easter egg dye kit with clear wax crayon (a white crayon can also be used on white eggs)
- ▶ Hot water
- ▶ Hard-boiled eggs

#### Instructions


- . Hard boil eggs in advance.
- Follow instructions on Easter egg kit to make dye.
- Using the clear wax crayon (you can use a white crayon if you can't find a clear one), write a secret message on several of the eggs.
- Ask the children to dip them in the dye and reveal the messages.

# Explanation

The wax sticks to the egg, preventing the dye from coloring the eggshell underneath. When you take the egg out of the dye the white egg shell that the dye hasn't reached should reveal the secret message.

# Application

Have you ever had a time when you weren't sure what God was doing? The disciples must have felt that way. The hidden ink represents God's hidden plan. Jesus rising from the dead is like dipping the eggs in the dye to reveal the secret message. God had a plan the whole time we just couldn't see it until he was ready for it to be revealed!

# **DEVOTION**

#### Washed Clean

"The blood of Jesus, (God's Son) cleanses us from all sin." I John 1:7

I couldn't believe it! A blue gel pen had hidden itself in the folds of my white linens and *survived* the washing machine, only to explode in the dryer. Really ugly blue stains were everywhere. My lovely white cloths were ruined. No amount of bleach would be able to remove the dark stains.

As I reluctantly consigned the towels to the rag pile, I was reminded of the Old Testament prophet, Jeremiah, and his lament describing the damaging effects of sin. By rejecting God and turning to idols, Jeremiah declared that the people of Israel had caused a permanent stain in their relationship with God: "Although you wash yourself with soap and use an abundance of cleansing powder, the stain of your guilt is still before Me, declares the Sovereign Lord." They were powerless to undo the damage they'd done. On our own, it is impossible to remove the stain of our sin. But Jesus has done what we could not. Through the power of His death and resurrection, He "purifies (believers) from all sin."

Even when it's hard to believe, cling to this beautiful truth: There's no damage from sin that Jesus can't totally remove. God is ready and willing to wash away the effects of anyone willing to return to Him. Through Jesus, we can live each day in freedom and hope.

Thank you, Lord Jesus, for completely removing the stain of my sin. Amen.


As part of our 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration, we will be raising funds to rehabilitate existing buildings at FLLC. As with any house or structure, proper maintenance is essential. The duplexes at FLLC are over 25 years old and the dining hall has been serving us for over 40 years. We have set a goal to raise at least \$212,000, which will fund renovation projects and provide better accessibility for summer and year-round groups who utilize camp. Construction highlights include replacing roofs, upgrading windows, installing new flooring, updating bathroom facilities, and making our buildings more handicap accessible. We are in the process of establishing a matching fund of \$100,000 that will be used to help with these renovations. A powerful tornado has ripped through Nashville and other parts of Tennessee, leaving destruction in its wake. At least 24 people have been killed, homes and other buildings have been destroyed, and thousands of people are without electricity. The tornado was part of a series of severe storms.

Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) is working with those in the impacted area — including the ELCA Southeastern Synod, Inspiritus (formerly known as Lutheran Services of Georgia and Lutheran Services in Tennessee)

and local congregations — to respond with immediate relief. Given the extent of the destruction, recovery is expected to take years. LDR plans to accompany the synod and Inspiritus to address survivors' needs over the long haul.

Gifts to Lutheran Disaster Response designated for "U.S. tornadoes" will be used entirely (100%) to assist those affected by tornadoes until the response is complete. Together, we can support those on the long road to recovery. Please give today.

## **RECIPE CORNER**

The only thing I recall from childhood for special foods around Easter, was that on Good Friday we had noodles with browned butter at noon. That was one of only two meals my Dad would eat without meat. The other was cherry soup, but that's another story.

While I would guess that most of you have a recipe for banana bread, I really like this one as it is nice and moist compared to most others I have tried.

#### **Banana Blueberry Bread**

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup vegetable oil

1 cup mashed banana (about 2 large)

1/2 cup sour cream

1 teaspoon vanilla

2 large eggs

2 cups flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 cup fresh or frozen blueberries

(I use 1 1/2 cups berries)

1/2 cup chopped nuts if desired

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Grease the bottom of loaf pan.

In large bowl beat together the sugar and oil. Add mashed banana, sour cream vanilla and eggs. Blend well. Add flour, baking soda and salt. Stir just until blended. Gently stir in blueberries. Pour batter in greased pan.

Bake 40-50 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.

I have not made this in a full loaf pan, but rather two smaller pans that I have from toaster ovens ( $7 \times 3 \times 1/2$ ), baking about 30 minutes. More usually, I make muffins and bake 15-20 minutes depending on how full the muffin cups are.

If using frozen berries, I find it helps to coat them with flour before adding to batter. Helps to soak up the extra moisture.

Since they are so moist, they freeze well and then I can pop one in the microwave for breakfast or a treat.

Hope you like them as well as I do.
