# VITAL LINKS

Carol Miles left November 8<sup>th</sup> with a team of 5 including Pastor Bill Moberly, new director of VLH and Awakening Lives to World Missions. They will be attending a youth conference for 100 age 18-30 people, planned by Pastor Chim Pich (Sam) LCMC Cambodian church. There they will be presenting health education, English, and a presentation about fetal development using models donated by Lutherans for

Life. They will then go to Vietnam, where they will hold a meeting with Vietnamese Nurses Association to plan the Vietnam Mission 2019 (June 19-July 3) presentations, medical outreach, Bible Study and time with the Gospel House Children.

They will also be implementing a Vietnam Internship Program for young people ages 18-25 for one month training and 11 months in Vietnam teaching English and friendship Evangelism. With the Vietnamese Nurses Association, they are also planning and developing a Conversational English classes for nurses using Messenger or Skype. They are seeking computer savvy volunteers and asking them to commit to once a week lessons for a 15-week semester. It will be one on one teaching with a program being developed by a new VLH member who is an English as a Second Language teacher and online teaching consultant. They will be starting with 10 nurses…they already know English medical terms and just must learn to communicate with the many foreigners in the hospitals and clinics.

The following is a letter from Pastor Bill Moberly regarding their mission trip:

Dear Friends of ALWM, LCMC Cambodia & Vital Links, our ministry in Vietnam,

I am in Cambodia with our ALWM Mission Team Nov. 9-19. Carol Miles, Marcia Fears, John Fears and I arrived Friday night in Phnom Penh. Pastor Matt Shields, our ALWM Young Adult Missionary Internship (YAML) Director, arrived Saturday evening.

Together we are doing some ministry medical assessments in 7-8 locations; doing some simple eye checks to see who needs reading glasses; preaching and teaching; leading the Young Adult Discipleship Conference with 85-90 young people; and exploring opportunities for future ministry partnership with Pastor Sam and some of his churches. On Nov 16 we head across the border to Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam for more ministry with our Vital Links staff & volunteers as we look ahead to our new Young Adult Missionary Internship (YAMI), and networking with our staff and partners.

Can you imagine that something as simple as the gift of reading glasses can bring joy? We saw more than 130 people at three churches- and this face says it all! Spontaneous joy and thankfulness when she could now see to read! How can you read God's word if you can't SEE to READ! We so easily take for granted things like this-but a \$1-2 pair of reading glasses is neither accessible or affordable. We distributed nearly 60 pairs of glasses, to church members as swell as village residents in each location, and we have three more this week. In all three the people were a mix of church members and people in the community that heard we were coming.

A nice outreach for each church, which will do the follow up and relationship building. We are in active conversation with Pastor Sam and his pastors about some exciting new opportunities to change lives in Jesus name both here, and for eternity
