

## Night Watches

During my college days, my summers were spent working at a guest ranch in the stunningly beautiful mountains of Colorado. On a rotating basis, staff members were assigned “night watch” duty – to keep an eye out for forest fires in order to protect the guests as they slept. What initially seemed to be an exhausting and thankless task became a unique opportunity for me to be still, reflect, and find solace in the majesty of God’s presence.

King David earnestly sought and thirsted for the presence of God (Psalm 63:1), even from his bed and through the “watches of the night” (V.6) The Psalm makes it clear David was troubled. It’s possible the words contained in it reflect his deep sadness over the rebellion of his son Absalom. Yet the night became a time for David to find help and restoration in the “shadow of [God’s] wings” (V.7) – in His power and presence.

Perhaps you’re dealing with some crisis or difficulty in your life, and the night watches have been anything but comforting. Perhaps your own “Absalom” weights heavy on your heart and soul. Or other burdens of family, work, or finances plague your times of rest. If so, consider these sleepless moments to be opportunities to call out and cling to God – allowing His loving hand to uphold you (V.8).

### **ELEPHANT STEW**

**1 Elephant    2 Rabbits (Optional)    Salt & Pepper to taste    Brown Gravy to cover**

Cut elephant into bite sized pieces. This should take about two months. Add brown gravy and cook for four weeks over a Kerosene fire, at 450°. This should serve about 3800 people. If you expect more, add the two rabbits, but do this only if necessary, as most people do not like to find hare in their stew.


## NEEDS PANTRY MINISTRY, 15 years of service



Open Wednesdays 9 to 4, the Needs Pantry is a place for families to pick up essential items (toilet paper, dish/laundry soap, shampoo etc) once a month. There is also clothing for their family. Many families utilize the clothing option as a foundation for their children's wardrobe and as a supplement to their own. There is no cost for any of these items or clothing. During the course of a year nearly 400 families visit the pantry, representing nearly 1200 household members. Our "Dining Room Table" and the "Couch Sitting Area" offer opportunities for our guests to sip a coffee, snack on sweet rolls, or have a meaningful and fun conversations with our volunteers and with each other. Stop in to see our newly painted and re-organized room. It is always a welcoming place to visit.

## IC HELP, 5 years of service INTERDENOMINATIONAL BENEVOLENCE HELP FOR OUR COMMUNITY



This Ministry's mission is to give a financial boost to families who have hit an unexpected bump in their road. Currently, we are supported by personal donations and donations from partnering churches. During a conversation with the recipients, budgeting skills are stressed. Utilizing a Spending Journal and a monthly/yearly Budget Summary we give the recipients tools to aid them in achieving financial stability. Help requested for housing assistance (rent, utilities) is the most frequently requested, representing 65% of the money distributed. Fuel-only gas cards to enable travel to out-of-town doctor appointments and other medical expenses are also frequently needed. We also offer information about other agencies who might be able to help our families receive additional support. Whenever there is a homeless need, we work closely with the Salvation Army to coordinate help.

## CHILDREN'S SHOPPING NIGHT, 3 years of service



Children's Shopping Night was created to give children the opportunity to 'shop' for gifts for their family members, all gifts are at no cost to the children. These gift items are brand new, donated by community members, allowing children to put wrapped gifts under their family's tree. Volunteer 'elves' help each child select appropriate gifts for each of their family members. Volunteer 'elves' then wrap each gift so that the recipients are surprised, since they do not see the gifts. On average, 30 children selected 175 gifts for their families. Santa and Mrs. Clause have children's Bibles and a bag of gifts to give each participating child so they too do not go home without a gift for themselves.


