## **CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARY**

Council items from November 10, 2019 (just approved at January 5th Council meeting):

• Everything is now approved for snowmobilers to ride up and park at church; will put an ad in snowmobile map next year; this year posters for local merchants

- Online giving is being set up; PayPal will be used, separate checking account to be set up as per PayPal stipulation
- Banked amount for sale of Parish House was \$137,555. The part of commission paid to Bill was returned to the church by the Wendorf's for specified general fund use
- Landscaping plan (Pastor Marin, the Tarkowski's, Hanson's in Rhinelander, and Michael Everson involved) to hopefully be presented to congregation at annual meeting in January
- Electronic sign still being pursued
- Budget for 2020 received by all present; approved with only change to Licensed Lay Minister cell phone expenses (decrease from \$400 to \$280); total budget is \$167,922 with a final shortfall of \$38,802.
- Thanksgiving dinner: Almost everything is covered, including what people from St. Mary's will contribute
- Deep cleaning of church: Bids still being received
- Mitten Tree: Wished-for items will come from Tri-County Council through Shellie Holmes, director
- Scholarship Committee to have a Trivia Contest fundraiser in early spring
- Chili dinner fundraiser for Vilas County Animal Shelter, date to be later announced

## DEVOTION

Expect the Holy

I John 4:9: "By this the love of God was revealed to us: God sent His only begotten Son into the world, so that we might have life through Him."

John the Baptist had been waiting for the Spirit to make Itself known. John did not know when, or upon whom, but he knew the Holy Spirit would eventually show him the Chosen One. Once John saw the sign at Jesus' baptism, he responded fully in faith.

That the Holy Spirit is present in everyone believing is at the heart of "The Rabbi's Gift," a well-known and variously-told story about a community under strife and in conflict. Then a stranger arrives and declares that a Holy Person lives among them. This leaves the community dumbfounded. Each wonders who it could be. "Is it Bob whom I find irritating? … Or Sally who makes a lot of mistakes? I have seen glimpses of holiness among them. I suppose it could be him or her." … The relationships in this community transform as they see others (and themselves) in a new light. The community begins to thrive and becomes known for its kindness and godliness.

What would it be like if we were expecting the Holy Spirit to alight on our family members, our coworkers, our congregation members, or even strangers at any moment? How might it change the way we see them and treat them? In this season of Epiphany we celebrate the ways Christ is born anew in each of our lives. The Spirit is revealed in often unexpected and hidden ways ... and can be easily missed if we don't open our eyes and our hearts to perceive it.

Let us pray for the grace to be like John the Baptist, expecting the Holy Spirit in the most unexpected among us and responding fully with joy.

May it be so!

## **RECIPE CORNER**

Well, February – what do you do with that? Thought of Cherries for Washington birthday or chocolate for Valentine's day. Of course, the chocolate won out. When I was working, it was routine for the birthday person to bring in a treat. Kind of backwards I thought, but once I took in this cake it was requested every year.

Death by Chocolate Cake

2 large eggs
3/4 cup vegetable oil
3/4 cup warm water
8 ounces sour cream
1 package devil's food cake mix
1 package instant chocolate fudge pudding mix
1 12-ounce package semisweet chocolate chips
In large bowl, combine eggs, oil, water and sour cream. Mix well.
Add cake mix and pudding mix. Beat until smooth.
Fold in chocolate chips.
Pour into greased bundt pan.
Bake in 350 degree oven for 45 minutes or until toothpick inserted in middle comes out clean.
Let cool in pan on rack for 15 minutes.

Invert onto rack and let cool completely.

Remove to serving plate and dust with powdered sugar if desired.

When I made this, I used a German Chocolate cake mix.

Homemade Valentine Dog Treats

Ingredients: 1 cup strawberries 1 banana 1/2 cup plain Greek yogurt (no added natural or artificial sweeteners) 1 tbsp coconut oil, melted (organic cold pressed, virgin, unrefined is best)

Instructions:

Blend all ingredients in a blender. Pour into a silicone heart mold pan and place in the freezer until frozen.

I love how versatile this recipe is, you can use any dog friendly fruit you have on hand. Strawberries are a great source of fiber and antioxidants, bananas contain potassium, and the yogurt is good for your dog's digestion. Coconut oil has antifungal, antibiotic and antiviral properties. 
