During those early years as a family they enjoyed traveling to the Northwoods of Wisconsin where they would vacation with Don's parents and brother's family on Found Lake near St. Germain, WI. It was on one of those vacations in 1960 that Don and Carolyn made the decision to leave their life in Speedway and buy the historic Warner Resort on the north shore of Plum Lake near Sayner, WI. That venture soon became Hammer's Northwoods Resort which they operated until the late 1970's. They enjoyed the relaxed life there and hosting many old friends from Speedway along with many new friends and guests from around the Midwest who would come to enjoy the fishing and area attractions. Carolyn transferred her membership from Speedway Christian Church and began attending Shepard of the Lakes Lutheran Church in Sayner. She soon joined the choir and enjoyed singing with them from the mid-60's until recently.

Don and Carolyn eventually sold their resort and bought a house in Sayner where they lived until Don passed away from cancer in 1984. From Tom & Carol Miles: You are awesome! We just received \$523 from SOTL – for Gospel kids & general fund for VLH. You help so much to keep our mission in Vietnam alive. Jan 31 – 4 faculty arrived from U. of Medicine in History of Chi Minh City Vietnam. They will meet with teachers at Mayo Clinic & Arizona State University for a program aimed at advancing nursing & nursing education in Vietnam. Our young lady – BeDung, did not get her Visa but with John McCain's help, we are hopeful that reapplication will work. She is a student nurse and is to meet her 92-year sponsor here in AZ. Some Gospel kids have been moved to start new orphanage. We will visit it in June. Team leaves May 30 thru June 15. We are recruiting. God's peace.

Dear Friends,

Thank you again for your generous support of Lutheran Disaster Response in 2017. As we reflect and begin a new year, I'd like to share some thoughts with you.

Because of your generosity, our church is able to walk alongside disaster survivors, meeting urgent needs and helping with the long road to recovery.

- In Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, we provided relief supplies to survivors and supported pastors so that they can focus on caring for their congregations and communities. We are currently assisting Lutheran Social Services of the Virgin Islands and the Caribbean Synod to build their capacities to respond to the disaster.
- In Haiti and Cuba, we've replaced lost tools for farmers affected by the hurricane so they can get back to work, helped woman-headed households with cash assistance, and helped families get daily life back to normal with dishes, cookware and blankets.
- **In Texas**, we're part of a group doing case management for survivors of disasters, and plans are underway for a respite retreat for rostered ministers.
- **In Florida**, we've supported our affiliate in providing crisis counseling for thousands of people in 20 counties.

And much, much more is in the works as we continue to work closely with our affiliates, synods, companions and other partners.

Our goal? To have more resilient communities that are less vulnerable to the next disaster. Thanks to you, we're on the way there. I've already been impressed by the resiliency of our neighbors who survived disasters. Here are a few quotes that stuck with me recently:
