<u>II Corinthians 4:7</u> "We have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us."

As a young mother, I tried to document my son's first four years of life. Each month I took photographs of him to show how he had changed and grown. In one of my very favorite pictures, he was gleefully sitting in the belly of a huge hollowed-out pumpkin I'd purchased from a local farmer. There he sat, the joy of my heart, contained in an overgrown squash. The pumpkin itself would wither and decay with a few weeks, but my son continued to grow and to thrive.

The way Paul describes knowing the truth of who Jesus is reminds me of that photo. He likens the knowledge of Jesus in our heart stored in a clay pot. Remembering what Jesus did for us gives us courage and strength to persevere through struggles, in spite of being "hard-pressed on every side." Because of God's power in our lives, when we are "struck down, but not destroyed," we reveal the power of Jesus in our lives.

Like the pumpkin that withered, we may feel at times the wear and tear of our trials. But the joy of Jesus in us can continue to grow in spite of challenges. Our knowledge of Him--His power work in our lives--is that treasure stored in our frail clay bodies. We can thrive in the face of hardships because of His power at work within us.

Father, thank You for putting Your Word in my heart and life, no matter what comes. Help others see You in my life and come to know You, too.

Recipe Corner

"Did you know? Wisconsin produces 60% of the nation's cranberries. It is the state fruit.

This recipe is from Mary Peterson (Pastor Norm's wife) which I first had at a WELCA cluster rally. I look forward to making it every fall and it has been well received whenever I take it somewhere.

Cranberry Dream Bars

Crust: 2 cups flour

3/4 cups powdered sugar

1 cup butter

Combine flour and sugar and then cut in the butter until crumbly. Pat this into a 10x15 jelly roll pan. Bake 15 minutes at 350 degrees.

Filling: 4 eggs

1/2 cup flour

2 cups sugar

1/4 teaspoon salt

2-3 cups cranberries

Chopped pecans (optional)

Blend eggs, flour, sugar and salt until smooth.

Fold in cranberries and spread over hot crust.

Bake another 25 minutes or until lightly browned.

When cooled, I drizzle with thin powdered sugar icing.

Notes: I usually cut down on the sugar in the filling – making it a little more tart. I also use more than 3 cups of berries, putting them on the crust until pretty well covered and then pour the egg mixture over.

I am writing to you because you have expressed interest in keeping informed about ALWM Mission Trips!

Our 2020 Mission trip to Vietnam, with an optional week in Cambodia, is now open for registration. The link below is active today.

I do also ask you to pass this along to friends, members at your church, post on social media, or use any other way you have to encourage people to apply.

In 2019 we had 13 people on our team from 7 churches in 6 states, so we can involve people from various churches without a critical mass or large group. The feedback from team members was very positive, and the trip was very fruitful!

We are actively in conversation with our hosts in Vietnam in planning for 2020. We have some amazing opportunities this summer with Dr Hang, our Vital Links partners and volunteers, and a local teaching hospital.

We also have very special college outreach being planned with IFES Vietnam. [Outside the USA, Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship (IVCF) does ministry as International Fellowship of Evangelical Students.]

In addition, I just spoke with Pastor Sam Chim yesterday, our coworker in Cambodia. There are some exciting new developments coming in our work together there. In addition, we are tentatively planning a second youth conference in Cambodia to be held in conjunction with the team visit in June - for those who join the optional add on ministry opportunity.
