PILL BOTTLE COLLECTION

The Hazelhurst Lions Club has begun a project to recondition and reuse prescription bottles. This article is a reprint: Once people finish their prescriptions, they either throw the prescription plastic pill bottles in the trash or recycle them along with other plastics. There is another alternative. That is to recondition and reuse the pill bottles. The Hazelhurst Lions Club have begun to collect them. In many parts of the undeveloped world, pill bottles are either scarce or entirely unavailable. By providing pill bottles they pills are secured and the instructions can be printed on the label.

Many members of the Hazelhurst Lions Club have volunteered to remove labels and wash the bottles. They have established numerous bottle collection sites throughout the Lakeland area, including:

- Minocqua Police Station
- Minocqua Public Library
- Save More
- Trig's
- Ace Hardware
- And several assisted care facilities.

Member Peter Fons collects the bottles on a regular basis and they are reconditioned by club members, sorted and packaged and forwarded along with other medical supplies to third world nations, war torn countries, refugee camps, and Doctors Without Borders. SIGHT FOR THE CHILDREN

Namibia 2018 June

Dust, daytime heat, nighttime cold, sundowners, puff adder tracks in the road, this was the 17th trip to provide Blue Bag health care that we have done. We now only work in Namibia secondary to the ease of which I can buy medications and the positive reception we get in the villages and schools. We concentrated our work within 100 miles of the Omborokko Mountains in North Central Namibia. This year we treated almost 600 children and 20 adults at 5 different schools and 2 conservancies. The schools were at Omihe, Mount Etjo, Sukses, Otjiwa, 2 of them have 2 schools, and the Otjozondjupa and Outjo conservancies.

For the most part they were very healthy compared to other years. This is a testament to the teachers and parents absorbing the information we have been presenting. I was very surprised by this. Mostly we saw upper respiratory symptoms, elevated temperatures and ear infections. We treated them with the usual children's Tylenol, Primatene, Claritin and Zithromax. I was pleasantly surprised that we saw no eye infections. Again this is a testament to good hygiene which we have been robustly educating the locals on. We also treated them for intestinal parasites with mabendazole (it kills the worms) and provided mosquito nets, which were much appreciated since the rains came late this year and there were plenty of mosquitoes. I saw some new children this year. You can always tell who is new to the clinic; they hold back and when they get to the spring scale they think it is new playground equipment, so they swing on it which makes it very difficult to get an accurate weight, but we eventually do after they settle down. I had help this year from Dr. Wil Pino and Paul "Slim" Walker, and boy does it go fast when everyone has a station to work. Dr. Pino would tell us the weights in kilograms, so we could get the meds ready, Slim would read the temperatures, Aaron would help organize them in a queue and get the names for the clinic book, and I'd dispense the meds and nets. I've been doing these clinics so long by myself, I had forgotten how fast you can move the kids through when you have help. I'm grateful to Shepherd of The Lakes congregation for supporting this medical mission we perform. We couldn't do it without out y'all. I'm sure we'll continue until we are unable "God is calling, I must go."
