Results of Special Congregational Meeting Held on Sept. 10th

Many people spoke both for and against beginning the process to withdraw from the ELCA at this meeting.

The ballot read as follows:

Should Shepherd of the Lakes Lutheran Church take the steps required to terminate our relationship with the ELCA in accordance with the procedure outlined in Chapter 6 and Chapter 7 of our Constitution that was approved by the Northern Great Lakes Synod on April 1, 1996.

YES to Terminate

NO Do not terminate

Results of the voting were 74 YES votes and 10 NO votes.

What this vote does is open the door to discussion and research on whether or not to leave the ELCA and do research on which other Lutheran Synod the church would affiliate with if the decision is made to leave the ELCA. These are the steps that our constitution requires us to take to begin the process. There will be more Question & Answer Sessions and monthly updates from the Church Council on what is happening in the process. Stay tuned for more information.

Information on Augsburg Lutheran Churches (ALC)

HISTORY:

- ALC is a 501c3 tax exempt organization classified as a church and allows its congregational members to use its tax-exempt number.
- ALC was formed in the aftermath of the 1999 vote of the ELCA Churchwide Assembly which capitulated to the demands of the Episcopal Church USA that required the historic episcopate (the ordination of bishops in direct succession to the Apostle Peter) as a stipulation of church unity. Said requirement is in direct violation of Article Seven of the Augsburg Confession.
- ALC has modeled itself after the American Lutheran Church, which was one of the three church bodies that merged into the ELCA in 1989.
- While ALC was initially part of Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC), it has always maintained a separate corporate structure and tax-exempt number.
- ALC parted ways with LCMC in 2006. Many of ALC's members remained with LCMC and ALC has remained small a "micro-synod," if you will.

STRUCTURE:

- ALC has a nearly flat structure, no hierarchy. Based on the 28th Article of the Augsburg Confession, which distinguishes between civil government (the power of the sword) and church government (the authority of the word), Augsburg has two officers: an Executive Director and a Presiding Pastor. They are assisted and advised by an executive council that may expand or contact as needs be. Ultimately, the final authority on legislative matters rests with the membership, and on church matters rests with the word of God.
- The Executive Director deals with the administrative matters of the body, decides on membership and various qualifications, and presides at the various gatherings of the body when it handles legislative matters. The Executive Director wields the power of the sword that is, the power to coerce behavior through temporal punishments or rewards.
- The Presiding Pastor deals with other pastors, essentially functioning as a pastor to Augsburg's pastors. In this role, the Presiding Pastor offers the counsel and comfort of the Word of God and the advice and wisdom of personal or shared experience. The Presiding Pastor wields the authority of the Word that is, the Office of the Keys to loosen or to bind sin.

MEMBERSHIP:

- ALC has three sorts of membership: 1) congregational; 2) chapter; 3) individual. ALC does not demand exclusive membership, e.g., all three sorts of membership are permitted (even encouraged) to join other church bodies, congregations, etc. ALC does not require loyalty oaths.
- ALC's congregational membership hovers between five and ten congregations which move in and out of ALC membership as congregational leadership and congregational pastors come and go.
- ALC's chapter membership numbers a dozen or so. Chapters are groups of people who gather, commit to one another, and apply to Augsburg for recognition as a chapter. This group of people may be part of a single congregation, dispersed among several congregations, or separated by various amounts of geographic distance. The chapter's essential purpose is to support one another in the preaching of Jesus Christ and to enjoy the fellowship opportunities available within Augsburg.
- To be an individual member of ALC, you simply ask. As an individual member, you agree with the distinctiveness of being a theologian of the cross and enjoy fellowship with the people of Augsburg. Pastors and preachers, brought into membership through colloquy, are the most prevalent as individual members.

ACTIVITIES:

- ALC has made several commitments: 1) theological education; 2) chaplains; 3) promotion of the historic faith; 4) promotion of fellowship opportunities.
- The Institute of Lutheran Theology (ILT) is Augsburg's designated seminary. ALC was critically involved in ILT's formation, it provides several faculty members, financial and prayer support, and it recruits students to ILT's educational programs.
- Many of the students ALC recruits enter the military chaplaincy program. Augsburg provides the director for ILT's chaplaincy program, and it provides an endorsing agent for the graduates of that program.
- In promoting the historic faith, ALC supports the German-Lutheran Ministerium (a group that preserves German language worship and preaching). ALC has recently begun investigating and promoting the Nordic Lutheran tradition.
- ALC provides fellowship opportunities; two formal and several informal. ALC's formal fellowship opportunities are its Chaplaincy Training event in January and its Pastor's Conference in September. Several informal events occur when its members come together to enjoy one another's company while they attend gatherings of other church bodies or organizations. ALC is also the organizing force behind "Societas Crucis," a fellowship of theologians of the cross (TOC); this fellowship gathers TOC without regard to their church body status or membership.

BENEFITS:

- There are two primary benefits in becoming a member of Augsburg Lutheran Churches: its people and its theology. ALC provides its members with fellowship on a regional and national level. This fellowship is that deep sort of community that comes when people know the truth about themselves: they are sinners yet nevertheless redeemed by Jesus Christ. Augsburg's theological commitments are singly and alone to the sole supremacy of Jesus Christ that is to say, "Jesus plus nothing equals everything." Recognizing the ultimacy of Jesus Christ relegates all other things to penultimacy. In this recognition, the people of Christ are set free to tend and nurture one another in their families, communities, and creation itself.
- Existing in this freedom, Augsburg members are left to seek out whatever other associations or memberships prove useful to them. Consequently, members of ALC may or may not be members of congregations belonging to other church bodies that offer a different set of benefits, such as pension and medical plans. Some Augsburg members are also members of two or even three other church bodies or organizations.


