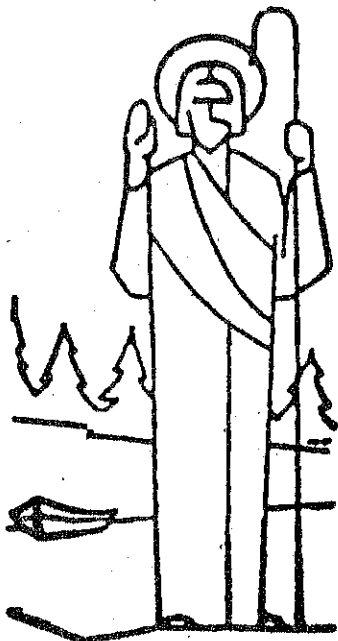

DEVOTION

Outside the Camp

Hebrews 13:12

"Jesus also suffered outside the city gate to make His people holy through His own blood."

Friday was market day in the rural town in Ghana where my college roommate, Rosa, was born. She once told this story: She recalled one particular vendor. Her fingers and toes were eroded by Hansen's Disease(leprosy). She would crouch on her mat and scoop her produce with a hollowed-out gourd. Some townspeople avoided her. Rosa's mother always made it a point to buy from her. Rosa saw her only on market days. Then she would disappear outside the town.

In the time of the ancient Israelites, diseases like leprosy meant living "outside the camp." It was a miserable existence. Israelite law said of such people, "They must live alone." Outside the camp was also where the carcasses of the sacrificial bulls were burned. Outside the camp was not where you wanted to be.

This harsh reality breathes life into the statement about Jesus in this verse in Hebrews, "Let us, then, go to Him outside the camp, bearing the disgrace He bore. Jesus was crucified outside the gates of Jerusalem.

We want to be popular, to be honored, to live comfortable lives. But God calls us to go "outside the camp"---where the disgrace is. That's where we will find the vendor with leprosy. That's where we will find people the world has rejected. That's where we will find Jesus.

Thank you, Jesus, that You didn't show any favoritism; thank you for going outside the camp for me. Amen.

RECIPE CORNER

This recipe is one I make frequently. It was submitted by Michelle in Ascension's cookbook "A Taste of Heaven". It is a good recipe for a non-vegetable eater like me and warms up easily for several meals.

Spinach Quiche.

1 cup small curd cottage cheese
3 eggs beaten
3 Tablespoon flour
½ pkg frozen chopped spinach thawed and drained
½ stick butter melted
6 slices Old English cheese broken into pieces
Mushrooms sliced
Onion finely chopped.

Mix together cottage cheese, eggs, flour, and salt.

Stir in spinach, butter, cheese, mushrooms, and onion.

Pour into a greased 9 or 10 inch pie plate

Bake @ 350 for 50-55minutes

Let stand 5 minutes before serving.

Notes: I used the whole 10 oz package of frozen spinach. I did not find Old English cheese and used cheddar instead.

I also added some chopped green or red pepper if on hand.

Present: Jack Carlson, Karen Carter, Joan Ebert, Sharon Geist, Jeanne Kroll, Jean Maines, Mike Pockat, Sharon Rice, Bill Sima, and Bill Wendorf.

The meeting was officially called to order at 10:37 am by President Sharon G. The mission statement was read aloud by all. (Reminder, Bill Wendorf, LLM attending meetings to provide information, will not vote on any issue.)

Opening Prayer & Devotion:

Bill Wendorf, LLM provided prayer.

Approval of Agenda: After review of agenda with addition made by Karen of art presentation under new business, motion made by Mike to accept agenda with addition, seconded by Jeanne. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Minutes: Minutes from June 12, 2022 reviewed. Motion made to accept minutes by Mike and seconded by Karen. Motion carried unanimously.

Selection of Date & Time for Next Meeting: Sunday, August 14, 2022 at 10:30 a.m.

Pastor's Report:

- Double baptism in past month. October 9, 2022 another baptism scheduled.
- Still operating under Covid rules and has to be invited for home visits, has made 5 recently.

Treasurer's Report:

- Brief review of May and June financial reports. Funds have been drawn from Money Market and have pulled from parish house sale monies.
- Review of May & June bank statements: Penny reviewed and had several questions. Copies of check requests and receipts given to Penny for review.
- Received notice of fundraiser for St. Germain Elementary school and backpack drive. In 2019 Shepherd donated \$500.00. Piggy Banks for donations are available and after discussion it was decided to request piggy bank.
- Sayner-Star Lake Chamber of Commerce: Membership for 2023 is \$75.00. Discussion concerning advertising in Chamber visitor guide and costs resulted in determination to not consider this option.
- Community Impact Report received from Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan passed around room for review.

Motion to accept treasurer's report made by Mike, seconded by Jeanne. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business:

No Parking signs: Signs and stands purchased. Installation to be done July 25, 2022.

Bell Tower: Rice's and Beier's to complete project.

Poster and pink fundraising envelopes to be placed in Narthex and pews.

Jackie made suggestion that distribution of Good Gifts brochures should be done before Christmas.

Motion made to accept Benevolence Committee recommendations made by Jack and seconded by Jeanne.

Motion carried unanimously. Committee members thanked for their work.

Art Presentation:

Karen brought in painting by local artist who has used wildlife themes to represent the seven deadly sins. Artist requests display in community room due to religious theme. Determination of discussion is that the theme is more Catholic in nature than Lutheran.

Saturday Evening Services:

Discussion concerning how lightly attended the services are this year. Largest number of attendees is 10. Will follow through with services for this season. May move all of them indoor due to amount of setting up required each week. If services not attended in greater numbers by end of season, serious consideration will have to be given to holding a second service in 2023.

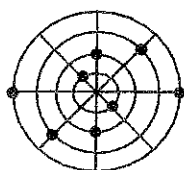
