DEVOTION

No Such Thing as Ordinary Hebrews 11:39

"They were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised."

When Anita passed away in her sleep on her ninetieth birthday, the quietness of her departure reflected the quietness of her life. A widow, she had been devoted to her children and her grandchildren and to being a friend to the younger women in her church.

Anita wasn't particularly remarkable in talent or achievement. But her deep faith in her Lord inspired those who knew her. "When I don't know what to do about a problem," a friend of mine said, "I don't think about the words of a famous preacher or author. I think about what Anita would say."

Many of us are like Anita---ordinary people leading ordinary lives. Our names will never be in the news, and we won't have large monuments built in our honor. But a life lived with faith in Jesus is never ordinary. Some of the people listed in Hebrews 11 were not named; they walked the path of obscurity and did not receive the reward promised to them in this life. Yet, because they obeyed God, their faith was not in vain. God used their lives in ways that went beyond their lack of notoriety.

If you feel discouraged about the seeming ordinary state of your life, remember that a life lived by faith in God has an impact throughout eternity. Even if we're ordinary, we can have an extraordinary faith.

RECIPE CORNER

This one comes to you from the "Feast at the Shepherd's Table" cook book because I (Jean not Sharon) forgot to ask Jan for a recipe!

Cranberry Bundt Cake

1 - 8 oz pkg cream cheese

1 c. butter

1 ½ c. sugar

1 ½ tsp. vanilla

2 c. whole raw cranberries

1 ½ tsp. baking powder

4 eggs

2 c. flour

½ c. chopped nuts

Blend cream cheese, butter, sugar, and vanilla. Add eggs one at a time and mix

well after each. Gradually add 1 ½ c. flour and baking powder. Combine remaining ½ c. flower with the cranberries. Add cranberries and nuts to batter. Pour into greased and floured Bundt pan. Bake at 325° for about 50 minutes. Glaze with thin frosting.


