God Holds UsIsaiah 41:10 "I will uphold you with My righteous right hand."


South African Freddie Blom turned 114 in 2018, widely recognized as the oldest living man. Born in 1904 (the year before the Wright Brothers built their Flyer II), he's lived through both World Wars, apartheid, and the Great Depression. When asked for his secret to long life, he shrugged. He admitted to not having always made the best choices of foods and practices that promote wellness. However, Blom did offer one reason for his good health: "There's only one thing, and it is God; He's got all the power...He holds me."

Blom echoes the words similar to what God spoke to Israel, as the nation wilted under the oppression of fierce enemies. "I will strengthen you and help you," God promised. "I will uphold you with My righteous right hand." No matter how desperate their situation, how impossible the odds that they would ever find relief, God assured His people that they were held in His tender care. "Do not fear, for I am with with you," He insisted. "Do not be dismayed, for I am your God."

No matter how many years we are given, life's hardships will come knocking at our door:...a troubled marriage...a child abandoning the family...terrifying news from the doctor...even persecution. However, our God reaches out to us and holds us firmly. He gathers us and holds us in His strong, tender hand. Believe it; He is faithful.

Lord God, assure me that You're holding me because I feel like I'm only hanging on by a thread. I trust that You'll help me and uphold me.

Amen.

Results of Special Congregational Meeting Held on Sept. 10th

Many people spoke both for and against beginning the process to withdraw from the ELCA at this meeting.

The ballot read as follows:

Should Shepherd of the Lakes Lutheran Church take the steps required to terminate our relationship with the ELCA in accordance with the procedure outlined in Chapter 6 and Chapter 7 of our Constitution that was approved by the Northern Great Lakes Synod on April 1, 1996.

YES to Terminate

NO Do not terminate

Results of the voting were 74 YES votes and 10 NO votes.

What this vote does is open the door to discussion and research on whether or not to leave the ELCA and do research on which other Lutheran Synod the church would affiliate with if the decision is made to leave the ELCA. These are the steps that our constitution requires us to take to begin the process. There will be more Question & Answer Sessions and monthly updates from the Church Council on what is happening in the process. Stay tuned for more information.

Chicken Casserole

1 Cup Rice 1 (10 ¾ oz.) Can Cream of Chicken Soup 1 (10 ¾ oz.) Can Cream of Celery Soup 1 pkg. dry onion soup mix 1 can water

1 chicken, cut into pieces

Mix dry soup with rice; add chicken soup, celery soup, and water and mix well. Pour into casserole dish. Lay uncooked chicken pieces on top of rice mixture. Cover and bake at 325° for 2 hours.

Dear Shepherd of the Lakes Lutheran Church Members and Friends,

As you can see on the first report, comparative 2023 - 2022, you have been very generous this year. Giving this year is \$57,000 + over where we were last year at this time. And because we do not take your generosity for granted, we have also been very careful in spending and have spent over \$20,000 less than last year. The combination of your generosity and our care in spending has resulted in a positive net income of close to \$9,000 as of September 30, 2023. I can honestly say that since we are not a business, but a church with benevolences, I have never seen a positive net income in the 11 years that I have been involved in your finances. Given how many churches are closing and in financial trouble, this is extraordinary! You are to be congratulated in your care of our church.

The budget vs actual report as of September 30, 2023 shows that your giving is \$42,000+ over budgeted (every accountant's dream!) and we are \$4,300 under budget in spending. This really is unheard of. I cannot thank you all enough. Quite a difference from last year.

I am calling a *budget meeting for Friday, November 10, 2023 at 1:00 pm here in the church office*. This is a vital part of planning our finances for next year and where we are sending our budgeted benevolence funds for 2024. *So I ask, plead, beg, and urge you to find the time to attend and help plan for next year*. No sign-up sheet or need to contact me unless you have questions, just plan to attend the meeting on the 10th. As a minor bribe for your attendance, I do provide snacks!!

Also along that line, we really do need to have an audit committee review both the 2022 and 2023 bookkeeping. We have a guideline to follow and it usually only takes a couple of hours at most. You do not need a financial background, just the ability to ask questions. I am setting an *audit meeting* for that purpose on Sunday, November 12th after church. Please consider volunteering for this once a year committee. Contact me at treasurer@sotlsayner.com to let me know you would be available for this vital service.


